Today, in his to Ephesians, Saint

Paul tells the Christians to whom he writes that they are should 'walk as children of light'. So that how they live their lives, speak, and work, should clearly show they belong to the Lord Jesus.

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In the first exuberant days of conversion when you first came to know Jesus, you may have found it easier to live as Children of Light. But just as the first Christian Communities, who earnestly believed that Christ would almost certainly return during their lifetime, you may have found that certain changes and adaptations of your Christian faith have been necessary over time. A recognition that we are not perfect, that we have weaknesses and that we preoccupy us.

In the midst of this we must not forget our priorities — and these must begin with an acknowledgment of our vocation. Of the calling that God has given each of us, ordained and lay alike, followers, as disciples, of His Son Jesus Christ - a Christian purpose.

Perhaps you do not have an of specific awareness what vocation or purpose you have? St John Henry Newman's meditation on vocation, and the holiness of of us may help:

"God has created me to do Him some definite service; He has committed some work to me which He has not committed to another.

I have my mission - I may never



know it in this life, but I shall be told it in the next. I am a link in a chain, a bond of connection between persons.

He has not created me for must balance a whole host of naught. I shall do good, I shall do concerns and responsibilities can His work. I shall be an angel of peace, a preacher of truth in my own place while not intending it - if I do but keep His commandments.

> Therefore I will trust Him. Whatever, wherever I am, I can never be thrown away. If I am in sickness, my sickness may serve perplexity, my perplexity Him; in may serve Him; if I am in sorrow, my sorrow may serve Him.

He does nothing in vain. He knows what He is about. He may take away my friends, He may throw me among strangers. He God's individual call to each one may make me feel desolate, make my spirits sink, hide my future from me - still He knows what He is about."
