

We also are blessed to have celebrating Mass and preaching for us, on his visitation to our diocese, our Archbishop, The Most Reverend Mark Haverland. We also welcome the new Mayor of Swale, Cllr Sarah Stephen, and thank Her Worship for joining us in our thanksgiving.

Before Mass we are to have an Act of Thanksgiving and then continue with our Mass as usual. The order for the Thanksgiving is available on a separate sheet.

Many years ago I had a brief, unmemorable, period of involvement in amateur dramatics. There was a nice old man in the company, who upon hearing that I was a Christian, said "That young man is the greatest drama ever!"

Let us consider the greatest drama ever as we think about our Ascension Sunday service today.

"While they looked steadfastly toward heaven as He went up, behold two men stood by them in white apparel: which also said, "Ye men of Galilee, why stand ye gazing up into heaven? this same Jesus, which is taken up from you into heaven, shall so come in like manner as ye have seen Him go into Heaven."

This is the last scene in the last act of the Drama of our Redemption.



When the curtain rose on the first scene in the first act, there were shepherds abiding in the field, keeping watch over their flocks by night. "And Io, the Angel of the Lord came upon them, and the glory of the Lord shone round about them, and they were sore afraid. And the angel said unto them, Fear not; for behold I bring you good tidings of great joy, which shall be to all people, for unto you is born this day, in the City of David, a Saviour which is Christ the Lord."

So it was at the end just as it had been at the beginning. Men looking up into heaven. Angels bending near the earth. In the beginning we have the angels centre stage announcing that He had come. At the end we have the angels announcing that He will come again.

In theatrical circles this provides an ideal introduction to a sequel ... watch this space! ... or as used to appear at the end of James Bond films "James Bond will return in xx"!

The sequel in our drama isn't really a sequel — It will be the climax!

In the Mass we celebrate and make present the memorial Our Lord Jesus Christ hath commanded us to make: having in remembrance His blessed Passion, mighty Resurrection and glorious Ascension; rendering most hearty thanks for the innumerable benefits procured unto us by the same.

In the Divine Mysteries we ourselves are made *one body* with Our Lord, that He may dwell in us and we in Him.

In the Divine Mysteries we are heirs through hope of His everlasting Kingdom, by the merits of His most Precious Death and Passion. At every Mass we adore the Risen and Ascended Lord, with Angels and Archangels and all the Company of Heaven. The scenes of His earthly life may, and have been, portrayed up to the Ascension. Beyond that He is in His glory which cannot be portrayed. And yet we see Him in the one way which is possible for us. He has given us His Sacramental Presence.

Faith our outward sense befriending, makes our inward vision clear.

Jesus veils Himself, yet it is the veil that reveals Him. The Sacramental Presence fills His temple with glory. It floods His sanctuary with the fullness of joy. In His Presence we find our peace, our strength, our comfort, our hope, our confidence and our joy.

The Kingdom of God is within us, and we already have our roles to play, our place in the programme of the great drama is assured.
