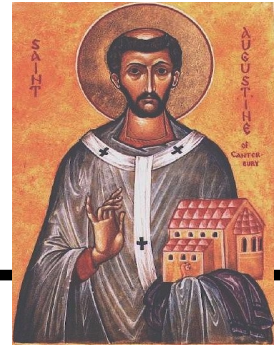

At the 11th hour of
the 11th day of the
11th month the guns

Western Front, to bring to an end the
