Please Turn off Your Mobile Phones In his Letter to the Ephesians, which we have as our Epistle today, St Paul tells the Christians to whom he writes that they are should "walk as children of light". This means that how they live their lives; how they speak; and how they work; should manifest that they belong to the Lord Jesus.

In the first exuberant days of conversion when you first came to know Jesus, you may have found it easier to live as a Child of Light. But, just as the first Christian Communities earnestly who believed that Christ would almost certainly return during their lifetime, you may have found that certain 'changes' and 'adaptations' of your Christian faith have been necessary over time. Certainly as time passes a recognition that we are not perfect, that we have weaknesses and that we must balance a whole host of concerns and responsibilities within alongside our Christian lives, can preoccupy us.

In the midst of this however we must not forget our priorities for these must begin with an acknowledgment of our vocation. Of that calling which God has given each of us, ordained and lay alike, as followers, as disciples, of His Son Jesus Christ. Perhaps you do not have an awareness of what specific vocation you have. Perhaps these words from Blessed John Henry Cardinal Newman's meditation on vocation, and the holiness of God's individual call to each one of us will help:

"God has created me to do Him some definite service; He has committed some work to me which He has not committed to another.



I have my mission - I may never know it in this life, but I shall be told it in the next. I am a link in a chain, a bond of connection between persons.

He has not created me for naught. I shall do good, I shall do His work. I shall be an angel of peace, a preacher of truth in my own place while not intending it - if I do but keep His commandments.

Therefore I will trust Him. Whatever, wherever I am, I can never be thrown away. If I am in sickness, my sickness may serve Him; in perplexity, my perplexity may serve Him; if I am in sorrow, my sorrow may serve Him.

He does nothing in vain. He knows what He is about. He may take away my friends, He may throw me among strangers. He may make me feel desolate, make my spirits sink, hide my future from me - still He knows what He is about."

Discovering our vocation, the specific calling God has given each of us, can take a lifetime to discover. But discover it we must strive to do.

Be honest with yourself and with God. Begin with the simple prayer "Not my will, O Lord, be done, but Thy will". Empty yourself of YOU so you can fill yourself up with HIM!
