After the last hymn we sing the Regina Caeli, which replaces the Angelus during Eastertide, before Our Lady's Altar.

On small а Dew Friends, brass plaque screwed to mν 'Cathedra', my Bishops Chair, which commemorates its donation to the Diocese, there are some words in Latin Ut digni efficiámur promissiónibus Christi. /Which translate as "That we may be worthy of the promises of Christ")

The *Angelus* is a common form of devotion, which we know well here at St Augustine's, which recalls the Angelic Salutation heralding the Incarnation of God. Although today, and throughout Easter-tide, we shall be singing the Regina Caeli instead as our Easter Anthem for Our Lady.

The Incarnation, the great central mystery of our faith, finds expression in the Hypostatic *Union*, the doctrine which seeks to define and explain to us the unique union found in Christ – the awesome wonder of the Union of the fullness of his Divinity and the fullness of His humanity.

However, the Angelus also points, through the phrase Ut digni efficiámur promissiónibus Christi (That we may be worthy of the promises of Christ) to another Union, as truly and wonderful a union as the first, which, in this Eastertide, should be in the iust forefront of our minds.

Christ is risen. Alleluia! He is risen indeed. Alleluia!

This is the traditional Easter salutation. The joy of Easter is joy in Our Lord's resurrection. It is inseparable from Him. Christians rejoice because Christ is risen. Christians rejoice because Christ shall all be made alive. In



Christ. These are the sustaining words of Easter. In Christ.

Our own resurrection is with Him. Our joy is that we are risen with Him.

Our Baptism made it thus. For in Baptism we were united with, and made members of, Christ. Our Holy Communion reception of Body and Blood, establish and strengthen and settle that union. Through this Sacrament of Holy Communion He dwells in us, and we in Him.

The meaning of Christmas is that this union exists. The meaning of the Passion-tide we have commemorated. is that Redemption saves this union. The meaning of Easter is that the Resurrection perpetuates it for eternity.

The meaning of the mysteries of the Incarnate Life is that sin is conquered and death is vanquished and the union preserved. That is the joy. Our joy today is to be in Christ. The joy of
